HONOLULU, HAWAII- ONCE A MONTH CHURCH- North Shore

What a delight to talk with Pastor Ron Valenciana and learn of the continued work that he and others are doing through the "Once-A-Month-Church" on Oahu's North Shore.

When Bob and I lived in Hawaii, we were part of the Hawaii Prayer Task Force, which was comprised of Christian leaders throughout the State. Week after week, we met to lift up issues that affected our beloved Hawaii, the government and the Christian community. Pastor Ron believes that our prayers served to birth the awesome work that is being done in behalf of those who have no permanent home address.

Several years ago, Pastor Ron was led to organize this unique church for homeless people. The church meets Once-A-Month at a North Shore Park. People come from throughout the area mainly to be fed spiritually and physically. All attendees hear a short sermon from the Word of God. They are then offered free on-site food, grocery bags of foodstuff, clothing and many are given money. No offerings are ever taken. Due to the generosity of some Oahu car dealerships, a drivable vehicle is made available to one person each month. The only pre-requisites are to arrive early and register; also, the winning person must have a driver's license and be able to secure automobile insurance.

Reading from the North Shore publication for December, Pastor Ron writes of hosting the annual Christmas Morning Breakfast and Operation Toybox. This event is held at the Haleiwa post Office parking lot on Oahu's North Shore. This Christmas Morning breakfast begins with a simple prayer of thanksgiving at 8 a.m. Then it's, eat, eat, eat until the food runs out. The meal is provided by the Turtle Bay Resort. Anyone who is homeless, needy, underprivileged, senior citizens, singles who might otherwise spend this morning alone are welcome to come.

There are countless giveaways. Each child attending the event will receive a new toy. Again, there are opportunities to win valuable prizes such as bicycles and bodyboards. The only requirement is to arrive early or on time to register your name.

The Once-A-Month church has been so successful that another has begun on a sister Island. Another has been planted on the mainland. In his excitement, Pastor Ron said: We now have buses to pick up people throughout the entire North Shore. Additional buses are being made available in order to pick up those who live in outlying areas.

Pastor Ron and his beautiful wife, Alexia, have observed that homeless people who are ministered to reach out to one another. Most winners of automobiles use their vehicles to help their friends get around the Island. The homeless show generous hearts and purposely set about to help others.

How exciting to know that Jalee Fuselier, a born again Christian, is the new Miss Hawaii and involved in Prayer Ministry.

One of the final entries of the year end Newsletter reads as follows:

"STATEWIDE PRAYER WATCH at ALOHA STADIUM – Saturday, January 8th, 2011. Doors Open at 3 p.m. This ecclesiastical prayer watch is supported by a network of Christian Churches. The prayer focus will include the Government, Military, Education, Businesses, Communication, Media, families, Church, Public Servants, Prisons and more. In the name of Jesus with the power of agreement, prayer changes things."

Of course, Bob and I remember our years meeting at colorful Aloha Stadium for praise and prayer. It is so refreshing to know that this important Prayer Ministry continues in Hawaii. Wish we were there with you all!! Our spirits join in with the other brothers and sisters of prayer.

MISSIONS UPDATE FROM MADAGASCAR:

Nomena, the young daughter of our missionary to Madagascar, has spearheaded a new project called "Project Niaina". Niaina is a Malagasy word. Her desire is to give a life to children who cannot go to school because of certain limitations. She is hoping to raise \$4,000.00 for reconstruction of a destroyed two room house. This house would school 120 children. The parents shared their concerns with Nomena's father, who was ministering in the remote area of Maevarano, about the lack of schooling for their children.

Further, she stated that the children could not attend school because there was no facility in the area. Since Dr. Ed works with the Federation of Protestant Churches (which owns this run down house), the parents asked if he could arrange for them to acquire and use this dilapidated house as a school. Of course, these villagers need funds to set up a proper school.

20 year old Nomena heard the call. Incidentally, Nomena and her mother are living in Southern California at this time. Bob and I had them over for spaghetti dinner a few years ago. The family is dedicated to the work of God and are a delight. Dr. Ed misses his family, however for now, his work in back home in Madagascar. Nomena is a feisty, intelligent girl who wants to make a difference in the world. When she heard of the concerns from Maevarano, she was touched. Her plans are to raise the needed start up monies very soon. She has chosen to make all financial gifts given for her 21st birthday toward this project. Thus far, she has gotten one-eighth of the funds for Project Niaina. Nomena plans to go back to Madagascar in January and return February 18th.

This is an exciting project. Anyone wanting to financially assist Nomena in this Madagasy outreach, please designate your funds to Nomena Project and send to Pathlight Ministries. Note: Normally, I give you the direct mailing address, however in this case, it is more prudent to use this Ministry. We will give you regular updates as to how this missions work is progressing.

CHRISTMAS SHOE BOX OUTREACH FOR THE CHILDREN

We are overwhelmed with gratitude to those who participated in our yearly Christmas Shoe Box gifting for the children. This year, we focused on four outreach areas close to home. (1). Fred Hildst Ranch: is a men/women's home that accepts and trains inmates who have recently been released from jail. Many have children. Since they have no resources, gifts for the children are scarce or non-existent. These folks always accept the gifts that you provide with gratitude. (2). Single Mother's Outreach in Southern California is always one of our favorite places to deposit gifts for the children. (3). There is a little housing complex in

our area where young "Ise" serves as our contact person. I have known Ise since she was about 8 years old. Presently, she is a sophomore in high school. Ise loves the Lord. Each year, she supplies us with a list of names and ages of youngsters from her complex. We are grateful to load up the Van and to drive the gifts over and make our deposit from Jesus. (4). Lastly, one of our board members identified the David and Margaret Home for foster children as recipients for our final load of gifts. **Thank you so much for taking the time to secure items for the gifts boxes, for the wrapping and for helping to support this seasonal outreach with so much love.**
